#### Grade 1/2

We have been continuing writing letters, texts, notes, lists, invitations, etc as part of our transactional writing unit. We have written letters to Jon and Barry, from Yarra Glen police station, to thank them for visiting us. We also wrote an invitation to the school production to those we'd like to invite along.

We have been talking about syllables in class to help us break down bigger words, to help us spell them. This can help us when reading as well.

In Maths, we are working on location with Meridith, while we concentrate on addition with Mrs Cole.

In Science, we have been doing an experiment with grass all week. We have three lots of grass in pots – one is a control, one we stamp with our shoe twenty times each day and the other we stamp fifty times each day. Please ask us about the findings because our experiment finishes today.

We have been working on our dances for the school production too. We are really looking forward to performing for you all.

#### Grade 3/4/5/6

As we edge closer towards the end of the term, students in the 3-6 classroom have continued their hard work.

In Literacy they are filming 'how to' videos, after writing scripts and rehearsing.

Maths has seen us brush up on skills in long division and practice our strategies for problem solving when attempting complex maths questions.

In Science, students have continued to look at the Solar System, and have utilised their homework to prove the earth's place relative to the moon and the sun.

PE has seen students play golf, as well as basketball, while we have begun preparations for next term's Earn and Learn program by submitting job applications and learning interview skills.
