Ski Trip





Whole School Writing focus

Our writing focus will be Recount. Recount **text** is a text that tells the reader about one story, action, or activity. Its purpose is to entertain or inform the reader. Some examples of recounts are:

- Personal recount - These usually retell an event that the writer was personally involved in.

- Factual recount - Recording an incident, for example, a science experiment, police report.
- Imaginative recount - Writing an imaginary role and giving details of events, for example, 'A day in the life of a pirate.'

We have been working on making inferences when reading. Making inferences requires students to combine what they are reading with what they already know, to reach into their own personal knowledge and apply it to what they are reading and looking for clues to support this knowledge. In a nutshell it's like looking for things that are not spelt out in the text (inferred) – how a character might be feeling and why. Pictures can help with the junior grades.

In Writing, we have created some excellent recounts and we are building on word choices – emotive and descriptive words, as well as time connective words like firstly, next, after, finally, for example.

In Maths, we have been working on patterns in number - growing patterns, patterns in multiplication tables, etc, as well as making graphs from information collected and interpreting information on graphs. We have also completed some further Essential Assessment tasks.
