Thank you to those of you who have offered to donate items for the Open Garden fundraiser and provided
yourself as a helper on the day. We'll let you know how much money is raised from the event.
Please note the dates above on your calendar, or in your diary. They are many important dates to make note of. I would like to commend the students, once again, but I certainly do not get tired of doing so, for their wonderful behaviour on our excursion to the city on Friday $14^{\text {th }}$ October. It was lovely to have staff thanked for the organisation of the excursion. Excursions to the city come with some stress, but the students were an absolute pleasure and conducted themselves in an orderly and safe manner. Thank you to our parent
helper, Mel, who came along for the day, and to staff who are always willing to attend such events.
Just a reminder that staff are not on duty until 8.45am each day. If your child arrives before 8.45am they will be left unsupervised in the yard. At the other end of the day, staff are on duty until 3.30 pm . After that time students are taken inside to wait until picked up, so that staff can attend to their planning, etc.
On Mondays and Wednesdays if you child is coming along after 8.30 am for Breakfast Club they must be participating in breakfast and remain undercover to eat and socialise until 8.45 am when the yard duty teacher appears for duty. The classrooms are not available to enter before 8.45 am . It was disappointing to find that recently there were some students playing in the classrooms before school, due to the fact that they had arrived at school before the teacher commenced yard duty, not on a Breakfast Club day. If you could please reinforce this with your child at home that would be fantastic, and respect that staff have many other things to get organised before their day commences.
Lilydale RSL have provided us with some items for purchase to help support soldiers who may have been wounded/killed in action, and their families.
We have poppies for $\$ 5$ and $\$ 2$, bag tag for $\$ 4$, wrist band for $\$ 3$ and pens for $\$ 5$. If you wish to purchase anything for yourself or your child it must be cash and placed in the money container as you collect your item (see below).
